

# Lesser Slave Regional Waste Management Services Commission Bylaw #1-02

**Being a Bylaw of the Board of Directors of the Lesser Slave Regional Waste Management Services Commission to govern the fees to be charged by the Commission for services provided.**

**WHEREAS** the Lesser Slave Regional Waste Management Services Commission has been established by the Lieutenant Governor in Council by Alberta Regulations 16-98 and made pursuant to the Municipal Government Act; and

**WHEREAS** the Board of Directors of the Lesser Slave Regional Waste Management Services Commission wishes to make a Bylaw pursuant to section 602.07 of the Municipal Government Act, 2000, Chapter M-26 governing the fees to be charged by the Commission for services provided to its customers or to any class of its customers.

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT ENACTED** as a Bylaw of the Board of Directors of the Lesser Slave Regional Waste Management Services Commission as follows:

## 1. Definitions

- a. "Board" shall mean the Board of Directors of the Lesser Slave Regional Waste Management Services Commission as appointed from time to time.
  - b. "Commission" shall mean the Lesser Slave Regional Waste Management Services Commission.
  - c. "Facility Partners" shall mean the members of the Lesser Slave Regional Waste Management Services Commission as appointed from time to time and their respective ratepayers.
  - d. "Non Facility Partners" shall mean individuals or commercial haulers who bring in waste materials from outside the Commission boundary.
2. The fees charged by the Commission for solid waste management services provided to Facility Partners shall be at the same rate at the landfill site for each Facility Partner, such fee shall be on a per capita or such other basis as may be determined by the Board from time to time and the fees charged by the Commission to Facility Partners and non Facility Partners shall not be less than the amount necessary to cover the estimated expenditures and expenses of the Commission less any grants, transfers from accumulated surplus funds or reserves or any other revenues.
  3. The Board of Directors of the Lesser Slave Regional Waste Management Services Commission hereby adopts the Schedule of Fees as attached to and forming part of this bylaw a Schedule "A" which may be changed by Board resolution from time to time.
  4. Bylaw 2-98 is hereby rescinded.





**SCHEDULE "A"**  
**BYLAW 01-02**  
**LESSER SLAVE LAKE REGIONAL WASTE MANAGEMENT**  
**SERVICES COMMISSION**  
**DISPOSAL RATES**  
**Effective: January 1, 2022**

**Residential Partners:**

1-500 kg is billed to respective municipalities – Town of Slave Lake or M.D. of Lesser Slave River

501 kg and over:

Domestic Waste	\$ 80.00/tonne
Construction & demolition (C&D)	\$ 80.00/tonne
Metals	\$ 40.00/tonne
Appliances including refrigeration units	\$ 40.00/tonne
Clean Wood for chipping material / NO Nails	\$ 60.00/tonne
Excessive recyclable materials in contents	\$ 220.00/tonne
Clean fill used for site reclamation	\$ 20.00/tonne
Municipal Collection/Transfer Stations	\$ 80.00/tonne

**Commercial and Non-Facility Partners:**

Industrial, commercial, institutional (ICI)	\$ 102.75/tonne
Construction and demolition (C&D)	\$ 120.00/tonne
Clean concrete, no protruding metal	\$ 60.00/tonne
Clean Wood for chipping material / NO Nails	\$ 60.00/tonne
Asphalt Shingles	\$ 120.00/tonne
Metal	\$ 40.00/tonne
Commercial Refrigeration Units	
Refrigeration gas must be removed	\$ 40.00/tonne
Clean fill used for site reclamation	\$ 20.00/tonne
A volume reduction of clean fill for site reclamation, over 10,000 tonne per individual haul contract, signed by the Commission Manager	\$ 15.00/tonne
Alternate Daily Cover:	
Mixed soil materials, may include wood chips, gravel or crushed concrete used for daily cover	\$ 30.00/tonne
Biosolids	\$ 30.00/tonne
Asbestos (48-hour notice) – Commercial and Residential Facility Partners Only. Permits and Analysis required plus, a handling surcharge Fee of	\$ 200.00/tonne \$ 250.00/load

Mobile trailers/buildings  
 Must be demolished and sorted of all recyclable materials  
 containing no Asbestos (Analysis may be required) \$ 110.00/tonne

**Mixed Loads:**

Mix loads containing at least 25% materials that could have been diverted.

ie: clean wood waste, metals, concrete, recyclables, etc.

Commercial & Non-Partners \$ 220.00/tonne  
 Residential \$ 220.00/tonne

Town of Slave Lake and Municipal District of Lesser Slave River are responsible for the residents' waste brought in by residents, not hauled by contractors, for the first 500 kg per load and will be billed accordingly.

**Bulky Special Handling Loads:**

These are loads containing very bulky, light materials such as: Styrofoam, Polly bags, tarps, plastic pipe, power poles, railroad ties, rig mats etc. These materials do not pack and take extra space in the landfill as well as create handling problems for the equipment operator. Loads with materials longer than 3 meters will not be accepted.

**After Hours Fees:**

Commercial & Non-Partners \$100.00/hour plus tipping fee  
 Additional Equipment Charge - billed accordingly as per the current Alberta Road Builders Rates

**Soil Containing Hydrocarbons:**

Parameters for acceptance at landfill:

Hydrocarbon Content <20,000 mg/kg

Chlorides <3,000 mg/kg

Flash point must be higher than 61C

The pH value must be no less than 2.0, and no higher than 12.5

There must be no free liquids as determined by use of the paint filter test

Soils must not be classified as a hazardous material under the provisions of the Alberta User Guide for Waste Manager

Copies of lab tests for the above information is required prior to approval of disposal.

Hydrocarbon Soil accepted as waste:

0-25% content of hydrocarbon and chlorides content \$ 30.00/tonne

Up To 100% of any of the above parameters \$ 110.00/tonne

Over 100% of any of the parameters not accepted

No soil is accepted with Flashpoint <61 degrees C

**Late Payment:**

Late payment charge for accounts overdue by 60 days: 1.5% per month on overdue balance
