Online Buy-and-Sell Exchanges

Residents: Stay Safe on the Market. Follow these “*Safe Exchange*” guidelines to protect yourself from fraud, theft, and harm when buying or selling in person:

Location Matters: Never invite strangers to your home. Meet in well-lit, busy public areas with video surveillance, such as a shopping mall or a police-monitored “*Safe Exchange Zone*.”

The Buddy System: Never go alone. Bring a companion, share your whereabouts, and set a check-in time with someone at home who can call for help if needed.

Spot the Red Flags: Be wary of last-minute location changes,

secluded spots, or “too good to be true” deals. Always trust your gut: if it feels off, cancel.

Vet the Other Party: Check account age and ratings. Screenshot everything—username, phone number, and chat history—as offenders often block victims to erase their trail.

Time it Right: Always meet during daylight hours and in high-traffic areas. Avoid nighttime or isolated exchanges.

Get Your Snowplow Flags

The MD’s Roads & Transportation team offers an opt-in snowplow flag service to clear driveways after a snowfall. Flags are available for purchase during regular business hours at the main administration office in Slave Lake, the sub-office in Flatbush, and the Smith Library.

Each MD-branded snowplow flag costs \$42.50 (\$21.25 for seniors) plus GST, and is good for one clearing. Payment can be made by cheque, Interac, or cash.

In addition to your flag purchase, you must complete our Private Driveway Snowplowing Agreement confirming that you understand the program parameters. The agreement and office/library hours are posted at mdlsr.ca/snowplow-flags.

To request the service, simply place your flag at the end of your driveway. Under normal conditions, snowplowing will be completed within 3 to 4 days following a snowfall.

March 1 Marks the Start of Wildfire Season

Fire permits are required for burning March 1–October 31. As Alberta gears up for another wildfire season, residents are reminded that *fire permits are required for any burning activities from March 1 to October 31*, with the exception of campfires.

Fire permits are **free** and can be obtained by contacting your local Alberta Agriculture and Forestry office — Slave Lake: **780.849.7377** or Lac La Biche: 780.623.5388.

The MD lies within the boundaries of the Slave Lake and Lac La Biche Forest Protection Areas. The Lac La Biche Forest Protection Area refers to any MD land located south of the Athabasca River, and the Slave Lake Forest Protection Area refers to MD land to the river’s north.
